For over 40 years, Alpharetta International Academy (AIA) has been a beacon of Montessori education in Georgia, a thriving, diverse, and community-centered school. Rooted in an international identity and surrounded by a uniquely peaceful, wooded campus, AIA offers children a rare balance of academic excellence, global perspective, and natural serenity. We seek a visionary Head of School to begin in Summer 2026 to guide our community into the future while honoring its strong foundation.

The school is situated on two campuses, directly across the street from each other, on a beautiful, wooded 5acre site in Alpharetta, Georgia. AIA serves 150 students in 10 Montessori classrooms, ranging in age from 18 months to 14 years, with 2 Preprimary/ Toddler, 4 Primary, 2 Lower Elementary, 1 Upper Elementary, and 1 Middle/Junior High School environments. The buildings offer spacious, wellequipped Montessori environments, bright, airy spaces, extensive outdoor playgrounds, and workspaces for adults. An abundance of print books is available, along with a student library staffed by a faculty librarian, accessible across all age levels. The school proudly supports beloved extracurricular programs, including Spanish, Art, Engineering, Cross Country Running, Physical Education, Music, as well as M.S./Jr HS business and fundraising initiatives.

Our international and multicultural community enriches daily life at AIA. Families, faculty, and students from many backgrounds bring perspectives that deepen the Montessori experience, fostering empathy, global awareness, and respect for all.

The Head of School (HOS) will work closely with a dedicated, highly collaborative leadership team, including a Director of Finance and Operations and Director of Admissions. Tuition revenues primarily support the school's operations, supplemented by fundraising for additional initiatives such as student field trips. The school operates on five acres with direct access to Webb Bridge Park, Alpharetta's premier wooded park known for its trails, greenery, and peaceful atmosphere. Families often describe the campus as calm and peaceful, with a quiet side-road entrance, tree-lined paths, and a private walking trail through the school's woods

A tenured, passionate, joyful, collaborative, and highly trained staff of Montessori educators serve the students of AIA with credentialed Montessori educators across the age levels. The school is governed by a Board of Directors whose members bring complementary expertise in business, strategic planning, human resources, talent development, and education. Collectively, the Board provides strategic oversight and resources. AIA has an operating budget of \$1.7 million. This range of professional experience ensures strong financial stewardship, organizational insight, and a deep commitment to the school's long-term success. The Board values partnership

and looks forward to working closely with the next Head of School in a spirit of trust, collaboration, and shared vision.

The HOS is responsible, in partnership with the Board, for the execution of the mission and strategic goals of AIA to produce the highest level of education consistent with the accreditation standards set forth by regulatory agencies. The new HOS must possess expertise and experience in Montessori education, board governance, and the business acumen to lead and execute all aspects of the school's operations. The HOS is accountable to the AIA Board, which is responsible for hiring and conducting the annual evaluation of the HOS.

AIA is seeking an exceptional new leader to be in place for the start of the 2026 school year.

Position Requirements

- A bachelor's degree (required); advanced degree preferred
- Montessori certification is strongly preferred; candidates with a deep understanding and proven application of Montessori philosophy will also be considered
- Minimum 3–5 years of educational leadership experience, preferably in an independent or Montessori school setting
- Strong skills in team leadership, staff development, and parent/community engagement
- Experience with nonprofit governance and working alongside a board is a plus
- Meeting all requirements of local, state, and accrediting/regulatory bodies

Benefits AIA offers a competitive package including health insurance, 401(k) with matching contribution, personal and sick days, fully funded professional development opportunities, personalized leadership coaching, and full tuition remission for the Head of School's children. Relocation assistance may be available for qualified candidates. The Board, together with external consultants, is committed to providing ongoing support and mentorship during the transition and onboarding period.







Application Process:

- 5. Five references (including email addresses and telephone numbers) that can be contacted confidentially
- 6. Other documents/media may be required later in the process
